

drew and updated my project. In the evening Eli came home with grocery and I cooked a pasta with fresh tomatoes and mozzarella. I also chatted with her and laid on the sofa with Myrthe to read my Meneghello book. For some reason I kept peeing throughout the evening.

Yesterday I woke up at Eli's place after a night spent with Livia and Myrthe in the same bed. After updating my project we traveled to Zeland where I bought a generator big enough to use the machines I need to build my project in the mountains. After that we parked the car just outside Middelburg and explored the nice city. It was quite cold and gray but the city was charming and we kept for a bit in a nice cafe and later ate some fried fish in the market while feeding Livia raspberries. After walking to a nice baroque church we walked back to the car and I drove all the way to Culemborg through quite some ugly infrastructures I did not think Holland had. At home I managed to get wheels on the heavy generator and transport it to our chicken house. Later I cooked eggs and cauliflower for us to eat. As Livia went to sleep I drew and then relaxed with Myrthe on the sofa while she watched her series. Later I went to bed to write my fable and read my partisan book.

Yesterday I didn't have time to do my morning update of my project as Myrthe had to go to work and I was left with Livia who did not want to take her morning nap. I then was out with her walking by the river and she finally slept. Back home she woke up again and I cooked a pasta with pesto for me and gave her some cauliflower and later some pineapple, which she ate for the first time. I later changed her and let her crawl around before trying to put her to sleep. She again didn't really want to and finally Myrthe came home and I could update my project. Later I went again out for a walk alone by the river to record my thoughts and gain some strength. Back home I prepared chicken and potatoes in the oven and also helped Myrthe to bake an apple cake. After eating I went to my study to draw and later also watercolour an illustration before relaxing with Myrthe on the sofa and later going to bed to read.

Yesterday I updated my project very early and then I was up with Livia and made a smoothie with the fruit we got from the market. Later I clean the garden from the autumn leaves and got the generator started. I thus could cut many iron bars I had stored in the chicken house and later weld together a closet for the kitchen. After showering I went with Myrthe and Livia to visit our pregnancy yoga friends. I first talked to a boring Dutch economist but then got to talk to Roberto and discovered further similarities with our father leaving us and other family matters. I felt relieved talking to him but soon had to go home to feed Livia and put her to bed. Myrthe and I managed to eat some leftover pasta that she started crying and at last I stood up with her to watch a small documentary about Chinese wild animals.

Yesterday I updated my project and then biked to Utrecht where Wis had her birthday. It was gray and cold and my legs still in pain from the last bike ride to Leiden. I anyway made it and ate some walnut cake and toasts. I then chatted a bit with Ivo and later went for a small walk with Myrthe and Livia. The latter did not want to sleep so I tried to put her to bed in the attic but at last we had to drive back home and she slept for a bit in the car. For dinner Myrthe made a pie with veggies and I managed to both work on my installation in the mountains playing around with QR codes and draw.

Yesterday Livia kept awake in the night possibly due to teething. I then stood up with her and then went to bed shortly before she woke up again. After giving her some fruit and playing with her I followed Myrthe's advice and tried to put her in her own bed but she was very stubborn and only after more than an hour she just fell asleep with me in the big bed. As she slept I could think about the textures for my cube project getting a good idea. For lunch I cooked Livia and I some pasta and later we went for a walk to see the horses and the chickens and sheep in the gray autumn weather. Back home Livia did not want to sleep again and I fed her some of the food Myrthe prepared for her. As the latter came home I could seat to redesign the textures for my cube installation. After sending them to the architect I ate the leftover pie and try to relax a bit but Livia was soon awake again.

Yesterday I manage a quick update of my project before Myrthe sat off for work. I then played with Livia and did some drawings after putting her to bed. Later we went to the market to get some fruit. For lunch I boiled some veggies and gave her a potato. She was quite easy this time to fall asleep and I spent time thinking about the textures for my cube after talking to the architect. In the afternoon we took a walk to the goats and then the ducks feeding them old crackers. Back home I cooked spaghetti and gave Livia one of the frozen meals her mommy had prepared for her. After giving her a bath she went to sleep and I started working once again to regenerate the textures. After a while Livia woke up again and we watched some TV before she fell back asleep.

Yesterday I updated my project and then played with Livia indoor as it was raining outside. We did manage a little walk to the horses and then ate some of the leftover potatoes. As she fell asleep in the afternoon I redesigned the binary patterns for my aedicula in the mountains. Later Myrthe came home and we walked out in the rain to get me a new hat. Back home I kept working on the patterns and then warmed the leftover spaghetti in the oven with broccoli and cheese. Livia went to be but she was soon up again and it took quite some time before she slept again. Lastly I did my drawings keeping her in my study.

Yesterday Myrthe was home and I updated my project before redefining the textures of what I now call aedicule, my cube installation I plan to build in my mountain terrain. For lunch I ate some salad and then took Myrthe and Livia for a small walk although it was raining. Back home I arranged to register myself in Italy as Myrthe could get some support if she figures as single mother. After drawing I showered and prepared lentils with feta and tomatoes. I then played with Livia and discussed further how to go about my registration in Italy.

Yesterday I updated my project and stayed pretty much at home with Livia who slept well in the morning and later also in the afternoon after I gave her some small pasta and I ate the leftover lentils. There was probably something in them because I felt bad in my stomach and had diarrhea the rest of the day. In the evening I managed to draw and then laid on the something watching a quite nice Lars Von Trier comedy.

Yesterday I felt a bit better and updated my project before taking a walk with Livia and Myrthe to the immigrant part of town. In the main square there were people dressing up like black Santa Claus helpers and we showed Livia their dancing performance. We then walked home with Livia that did not manage to sleep. For lunch I cooked rice with broccoli and managed to eat it. Afterwards I put Livia to sleep and updated my project as well as I started a new illustration. Later in the afternoon I tried to glue together a small version of the textures of my aedicule but had no glue left. In the evening it was raining but we anyway went out to buy some fries which we ate at home with salmon. Livia did not want to fall asleep at night and I kept her up with me colouring my illustration.

Yesterday I still had diarrhea and could only drink water. I anyway had the energy to update my project and later take a walk with Livia and Myrthe. Despite the rain we fed the goat and the birds by the playground and later got home that Livia had a fever. I actually put her to be several times but kept being tired. I then ate some white rice and we put her back to bed. After drawing I relaxed a bit on the sofa and then went to bed to write and read but Livia was soon awake again and we spent almost the entire night up after she vomited.

Yesterday I tried to keep Livia to bed after a rough night. When we woke up we both ate some yogurt and then went for a walk to check the goat, the horses, the ducks, the parrots and the deer. Back home I steamed some potatoes and gave one to Livia eating the rest myself. In the afternoon Livia could sleep properly and I had the time to update my project and draw. As Myrthe came home and I cooked a chicken soup with egg noodles and veggies and then got to talk to the architect about the aedicula. In the evening I helped Myrthe to set up a mattress next to Livia's bed so that she can try sleeping there with her. Later I prepare a mock up of the mobile application that will allow visitors to retrieve data from the the aedicula.

Yesterday I woke up very early and updated my project. We then went to Utrecht where I took a walk with Livia from her mom's academy all the way through the city. She slept in the carrier bag and woke up that I reached the nice park on the opposite side of town. There was a little recreational farm there where we spent some time with the animals before going inside a building for children to play. It was quite a discovery since I never knew before a place where Livia could be indoor to let her crawl and give her food and change her diaper. There I met a Kurd from Syria with his baby girl and talked to an old Tibetan woman. The afternoon was pleasant and sunny. Livia slept in the stroller while I crossed back the entire city to reach Myrthe and I eat a quite bad Turkish pizza. After driving back home I got to talk to August on the phone and prepared an apple cake which we ate after a simple salad. In the evening I drew and watched the news before writing and reading.

Yesterday I woke up very early and updated my project. I then went to bed for an hour and got up to look after Livia. Together we played and then went out to feed the goat and the sheep with old bread and buy some tea. At home I gave her yogurt and cooked a pasta before vacuum cleaning downstairs and putting her to bed. She took some time to fall asleep and did not sleep much. I then gave her a bottle and we went out again in the rain to post some cards for her mom. As the latter came home I finished vacuum cleaning upstairs and sat in my study to draw. For dinner Myrthe cooked stamppot and after eating I watched the nice old movie "Fahrenheit 451". Back in bed I tried to read more Meneghello after finishing the nice "I Piccoli Maestri" but found he didn't have so much more interesting thing to say as a professor beside again his life as a partisan.

Yesterday I woke up early again and updated my project. Myrthe had her free day and I spent the morning finishing one illustration to complete a whole series so that I can archive it in Italy next week. Later I took a small walk with Myrthe and Livia and did a bit of grocery. Back home we ate the leftover stamppot and I prepare a sauce to bring to Belgium tonight. Later I went back up in my study to scan all the illustration and later also all the drawings I made in the last month. I also got to talk to August on the phone for a long time and we had good ideas on what to do with the aedicula in the mountains and where to position it so to keep the old cathedral scheme. For dinner I steamed fish with cauliflower and peas. After drawing we got to see an episode of New Zeland series and then I went to bed to write and start a book by Cognetti as people kept telling me they reminded me of him.

Yesterday I woke up early and updated my project and also begun to redesign the elements around the aedicula so that one day I can show my entire project. As Myrthe went to work Livia and I took a small walk to the goat and sheep and fed them old bread. We also bought some bread and a big box wipes for her butt. Back home I fed Livia some yogurt, bread and a clementine while I ate the leftover veggies with fish. In the afternoon it was easy to put Livia in her bed to sleep and I kept working on the reconfiguration of my miniaturized cathedral. After Livia woke up we packed to drive with Belgium, in a mansion in the Ardennes where we are supposed to spend the weekend with all Myrthe's brothers and families. It was raining hard and I drove the first bit and after stopping at a fast-food to feed Livia Myrthe drove the rest. We finally reached the mansion and I cooked some past with the bolognese sauce I prepared. After eating all together I also made tiramisú and in the evening when the kids where asleep the adults went in the outside Jacuzzi.

Yesterday we woke up in the big Ardennes mansion and I updated my project briefly before cooking for everyone eggs, beans and bacon. After breakfast it was raining but I anyway went for a walk to explore the surrounding. I did not want to venture where my instinct told me to as there were dogs and hunters spread around. Back home I looked after Livia and then we went off to do a small hikink in the forest but Ivo lead us to the wrong place and I had to take over the situation bringing everyone across a road and then through the forest back on another road. The forest themselves where quite abused but some parts retained the old characteristic. Back in the car I drove alone with Myrthe and sleeping Livia to La Roche, a nice village heavily affected by the Nazi liberation. After strolling around we drove back home and I ate some tiramisú. I pretty much spent the evening redesigning my cathedral taking the aedicula as a starting point. For dinner we ate some boar that Ivo wanted to cook and in the evening Livia had really tummy pains and cried for quite some time.

Yesterday it was again raining in the Ardennes and I updated my project this time seating on the floor to relief my back. As the Myrthe and Livia woke up we ate some bread with eggs and then we took a bath. Later we went for a walk but as it was raining only Ivo and I continued through the meadows and back to the mansion. There Livia did not want to sleep so I quickly packed all our stuff and cleaned our room and did the dishes and vacuum cleaned so that we could make her asleep on our way back. Myrthe did not like the plan but it worked and I managed to drive all alone first through the nicely forested hills of the Ardennes and then through the Netherlands up to Culemborg. Livia slept all the way and back home I unpacked the car and warmed the leftover pasta up in the oven. After eating I drew and later we were planning to have a relaxing evening but Livia kept awake with a red cheeks probably as she is teething.

Yesterday it was raining outside and I updated my project before taking care of Livia and use some old wooden beams to build a door to put on top of the staircase and prevent her from falling. I also managed to put her to sleep without any issues and started to rethink the cube idea reintroducing the photo panels in the front. At noon I gave Livia some of the bread we brought from Belgium with peanut butter and I ate a salad. Later Livia slept again without problems and I could keep working on my project. We went out to buy some metal things to fix the new fence I built to the wall and on the way back it rained. We took shelter in the supermarket where we bought milk and yogurt. Back home Myrthe arrived and I mounted the fence. Later she cooked pita with veggies and I ate before going to my room to draw. In the evening Livia was quite asleep and we watched a bit of a boring series before I went to bed to write.

Yesterday I woke up early and updated my project. I then played with Livia and later did not manage to get her to sleep so we took a stroll in the market and bought some fruit. Back home she slept and I kept adjusting the aedicula of my mountain project. For lunch I gave Livia some yogurt and bread with peanut butter while I ate a salad. In the afternoon we walked all the way to Roberto only to find out he was already in a cafe in the city. We then walked back under the rain and kept some hours with him and his Dutch dancer friend and a nice Sicilian guy with whom I talked about my project. Livia was very explorative of the small cafe and at last I took her home to sleep. I managed to cook a past with fresh tomatoes and paprika and gave it to Livia and Myrthe when she came home. In the evening my head was quite full and I watched a nice South Korean movie title "3-iron". At night I felt nauseous and could not write nor I kept reading the Cognetti book which I found too pleasing to be a book describing mountain life.

Yesterday I woke up again very early and updated my project. I then took care of Livia and managed to put her to bed and continue working. Later we took a small walk into town and bought some empty CDs, some bread for Livia and three Dutch farmer cheeses to bring as present during my upcoming trip south. I also went to the city hall to ask for the papers I need to get unregistered from Holland now that I am registering in Italy. For lunch I gave Livia the bread and a clementine while I ate a salad. Later she slept without any issues and I could talk on the phone with the architect to explain him my intention to leave the front face of the cube empty. As Livia woke up I gave her bottle and then went with her to Judith to give her husband's DVD I never managed to watch. Livia could then play with the kids and soon Myrthe also reached us. On the way back home I bought salmon and fries which we ate. Livia kept up all evening with me as Myrthe had to work. After drawing I kept with her in the living room and burnt music on the CDs we bought so that we can listen to them in the car during all the upcoming traveling in Italy.

Yesterday I woke up very early to update my project and then drove with Myrthe and Livia to Utrecht. There was a lot of traffic but managed to park by her old academy and walk to the city together. There I showed her the little zoo I have discovered and let Livia crawl around in the playing room and later showed her the animals before eating together the bread I brought along with some veggies. After Myrthe left for work I let Livia crawl some more and changed a pooh diaper before making her sleep in the stroller and walk to the university library to return the Meneghello book (really only worth of one story, the "Piccoli Maestri"). I also got a printed and plastified copy of the map I have prepared to know where to dig the new layout of the cathedral in the mountains. Back at the art academy I let Livia play around in the cafeteria and even got her in a shopping cart driving her around. As Myrthe finished to work we drove home where I started packing all my equipment to bring to Italy, feeling very unsure whether to bring the argon gas cylinder of my welder with much confusion on the internet and no one of my friends seriously wanting to help. In the evening we ate a couscous with a veggie sauce and some pudding before I went up to my study to draw.

Yesterday I woke up early and updated my project. I then played with Livia and then walked with her to the municipality where I officially moved out of the Netherlands. As we came back I got a good idea about the patterns for the aedicula and worked on them after managing to get Livia to sleep. For lunch I prepared a pasta for me and her and then we took a small walk to the river given that there was some sun. I also showed Livia the cows in a field and then walked back home to put her to bed and keep working on the textures. When she woke up we went to do grocery for Myrthe and Hanneke who came in the evening. Later I finished to pack the car and picked Cas and drove with him to Maastricht at Ivo's place where we had a nice evening the three of us and Karen.

Yesterday I woke up very early in Ivo's villa and updated my project to go back to bed for a bit. As Cas also woke up we got on the road to the Ardennes. We talked quite a bit and finally got to the mechanic where his car was repaired. Later we drove to a nice village in a valley and ate some croissants and a drank a cappuccino. He then drove back to the Netherlands while I kept driving south. As I reached Bastogne I decided to check the World War II memorial there and what a surprise to see a lot of folk in old military clothes commemorating the last Nazi offensive blocked by the Americans. I got to talk to some soldiers and photographed them before hitting the road through Luxembourg where I got some gasoline. It was nice to travel through France and at last I stopped in Strasbourg also to see the places of the last terror attack. I was impressed by the city which was however too overcrowded and with soldiers and much police. Back on the road I drove to Mullheim and spent the evening playing with Florian daughters in his nice farm. Later I cooked potatoes for us with melted cheese and we talked about his new projects although I am still very impressed about his talent as a painter, yet I guess European society doesn't want to go for that kind of manual talent anymore.
